Feb Mocks	WB Feb 25 th	SLT/Exams office/Heads of Faculty	 Year 11 to sit mock exams in all subjects that they will sit in summer 2019 Mock results will give Year 11 staff a gap analysis of where students are underperforming in their subjects to allow for more extreme intervention to take place if needed
Mock 'Results Day'	TBC	ROC/Exams office	 Year 11 to be given results in 'summer exam results day' fashion, as per summer results day to motivate them to either continue with their current performance or improve depending on outcome Parents to receive mock results as well
Yr11 Revision Area	4 th Feb	ROC/KWI	 Year 11 common room to be allocated an area with revision guides for all subject areas, paper, flash cards, resources etc. so that they can revise during their lunch time if not attending 'lunch and learn'
Yr11 'Lunch & Learn'	WB 21 st Jan	KWI/ROC (supporting)	Every lunch time (40mins) students who want to revise in a quieter area, with good ICT access, can receive a queue jump card for lunch so they can get food early and then bring that to TWA library where it will be staffed for revision
Academic Mentor Groups	WB 28 th Jan	SLT/key staff	Key students to be allocated a mentor/coach who will meet on a weekly basis to discuss their progress and attitudes to learning with a more academic foci

Walking Talking Mocks	Ongoing	Head of Faculty	- Staff and students to complete a 'walking talking mock' once every two weeks, to help students engage and understand the exam writing process and how to maximise their marks in exam conditions

Easter revision sessions	Easter	ROC	 Timetabled sessions to be run over the half term to support students' learning Parents to be informed of sessions by Wednesday 30th Jan, to help avoid holiday/appointment clashes
Focussed Maths Intervention	WB21st Jan	SLT/Head of Maths	 Jacqueline Cashman, working 1 day a week at TWA, to be given target cohorts of Year 11 students who are underperforming in Maths to work with in small group ratios
Focussed Technology Intervention	WB21st Jan	SLT/Faculty Leader	 Ex TWA staff member coming into support with lessons and cover as well as working with targeted groups of students at risk within Health and Social Care, Technology and Textiles
Non-Exam Based intervention time	Ongoing	ROC/KWI/Head of Faculties	 During non-examination time tabled lessons (Core PE and Citizenship) students underperforming in Business, Computer Science and other bucket 3 qualifications (where staff are available), key cohorts of students are taken out to complete additional work
Year 11 focussed attendance draw	Ongoing	Year Team	 Ongoing attendance incentives, rewards etc. to encourage better attendance in key cohorts in Year 11 using the PP funding
Exams set up/breakfast warm sup sessions	May	ROC/KWI/Head of Faculties	- Pre exam meetings in training room for every exam, choice of pen, new equipment, Skittles, motivational music etc.
GCSE Chemistry Intensive Revision Day	TBC	ROC/Head of Faculty	 Subject focus day Targeted borderline students to complete a full days intensive revision on Chemistry, from feedback from Feb Mocks
GCSE French native speaker support	TBC	KLE/Head of Faculty	Native French speaker to provide support with oral exams for a 4 hour period.
